When mixed with water, it's ready to use render for indoor and outdoor use. The render are sprayable and pumpable in a 60m hose. base 132 can be delivered in closed silos of 10 tons with a flow mixer to avoid dust.

### Cut-off criteria:

All major raw materials and all the essential energy is included. The production processes for raw materials and energy flows with very small amounts (less than 1%) are not included. These cut-off criteria do not apply for hazardous materials and substances.

### Data quality:

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. They represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. Background data is based on registered EPDs according to EN 15804, Ostfold Research databases, ecoinvent and other LCA databases. 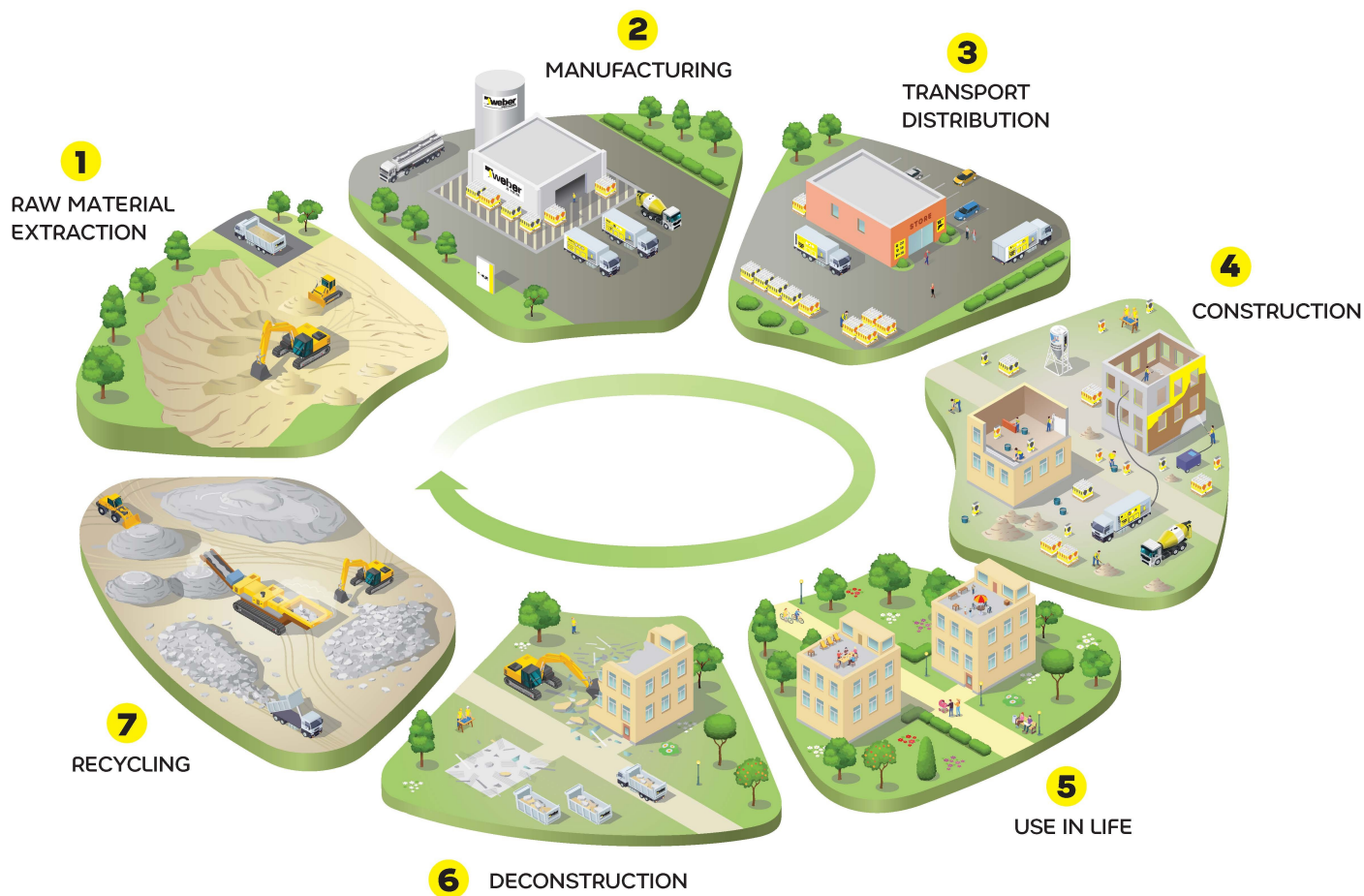
### Allocation:

The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Incoming energy and water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.

**System boundary:**

All processes from raw material extraction, product transport, the construction site, assembly, end of product life and beyond the system boundaries are included in the analysis. The basic production process involves mixing of various raw materials.

The flow chart below illustrates the system boundaries for the full life cycle analysis.



**Additional technical information:**

The remaining powder is classified as hazardous waste. Cured material is inactive and not classified as hazardous waste and may be disposed as construction waste to disposal or recycling.

The packaging properly emptied is not classified as hazardous waste.
